NEWFOUNDLAND AND LABRADOR HYDRO SUPPLEMENTARY EVIDENCE OF D.W. REEVES

1	Q.	What is the purpose of this supplementary evidence?
2		
3	A.	Hydro has recently determined that there are some inconsistencies in the
4		cost allocations used in the preparation of the 2002 Cost of Service filed
5		with Hydro's pre-filed evidence and explained in response to NP-132(a).
6		These inconsistencies are primarily in the allocation of operations and
7		maintenance costs of the Central Region of Transmission and Rural
8		Operations.
9		
10	Q.	What are the primary categories affected by these changes?
11		
12	A.	The primary areas affected by these changes are:
13		
14		Central transportation equipment
15		Central transportation labour
16		Central transmission
17		Central lineworker labour
18		Some regional common expenses
19		
20	Q.	Why are these changes necessary?
21		
22	A.	The Central region provides transportation (helicopter, transport) and
23		transmission (vegetation control) services for all three regions, Central,
24		Northern and Labrador. These services were not properly reflected in the
25		original allocation.
26		
27		With respect to the Central lineworker labour allocation, these costs were
28		originally assigned fully to the transmission function, however it would be

1 more appropriate to split these costs between transmission and 2 distribution. 3

Some of the regional common expenses were originally functionalized in accordance with the "All Plant Related Overhead" allocator. Now, these common expenses are functionalized with a revised allocator (excluding hydraulic and Holyrood) which is in line with the functions they support in the region.

10 Q. Please provide a summary of the above noted changes?

11

12 Α. Mr. Brickhill, in Supplementary Evidence, will outline the impact of these 13 changes in the 2002 Cost of Service Study and Mr. Hamilton, in 14 Supplementary Evidence, will outline the effect on customers' rates. In 15 addition, a revised NP-132(a) will be filed to reflect the changes as noted 16 above.
