Q. On page 6, lines 8 to 10 of Mr. Hamilton's Prefiled Testimony he indicates that non-firm industrial rates should recover all incremental costs of providing the service and provide a contribution towards the fixed cost of the relevant generating plant. Provide the analysis that shows that the non-firm rate is, in fact, meeting this objective.

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A. The energy portion of the rate recovers the actual fuel cost incurred to provide the non-firm energy. Other indirect costs are recovered through the 10% surcharge on energy and the \$1.50 /kW demand charge. Please see response to IC-44 (3) for explanation of 10% surcharge on the energy portion of the non-firm rate and the response to NP-183 for explanation of the demand charge portion.
