process with respect to the Wabush Terminal Substation and are they required to approve budgetary costs or cost overruns?

Have the Iron Ore Company of Canada and Wabush Mines been informed of the change in forecast 2004 costs for the Wabush Terminal Substation?

Have the Iron Ore Company of Canada and Wabush Mines approved the 2004 budget for the Wabush Terminal Substation including the forecasted additional costs?

Provide a detailed explanation for the decreases referred to in Lines 24-27 in the evidence of Sam Banfield dated October 31, 2003. In your answer please provide detailed information as to the decreases in Labrador West and Happy Valley – Goose Bay areas respectively.
