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- Q. If the Board ordered Hydro to charge a demand/energy rate to Newfoundland Power and directed Newfoundland Power not to modify its seasonal storage pattern so as to increase the likelihood of spillage (such direction being made for the purpose of implementing the policy contained in Section 3(b) of the EPCA), would the incentive to modify storage patterns remain and would Newfoundland Power feel itself at liberty to act upon such incentive.
- A. Newfoundland Power operates its hydraulic generating facilities in the best interests of the overall system in accordance with Section 3(b)(i) of the *Electrical Power Control Act*, 1994 which states that all sources and facilities for the production, transmission and distribution of power in the province should be managed and operated in a manner that would result in the most efficient production, transmission and distribution of power.
- It is Newfoundland Power's position that the Sample Rate proposed by Hydro provides an incentive for the management of generation facilities that is contrary to Section 3(b)(i) of the *Electrical Power Control Act* in this respect, and is therefore inappropriate.
