

1     Q.     In the response to CA-80-NLH, Hydro has interpreted items C, E. F. H, I, and  
2           J as being either Not Applicable or Negligible. If a calculation cannot be  
3           made, explain why. Please also provide all figures including those regarded  
4           by Hydro as Negligible.

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7     A.     Hydro did not provide a response to CA 80 NLH (c), as Hydro's purchases of  
8           *Capacity Related Energy Purchases in GWh* are negligible in its total supply.  
9           These purchases would typically be from Newfoundland Power and are  
10          provided in the table below. Hydro's power purchases were provided in CA  
11          80 NLH (d).

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13          Hydro's total supply of electricity is comprised of its own net generation and  
14          purchases from non-utility generators and CF(L)Co. Hydro does participate in  
15          interchanges where an interchange is taken to be a common interconnection  
16          point amongst neighboring utilities. For this reason, items CA 80 NLH (e), (f),  
17          and (i) were considered to be not applicable. Hydro does occasionally  
18          purchase secondary energy from Abitibi Consolidated and Corner Brook Pulp  
19          and Paper and this information, along with its unit expense, is provided in the  
20          following table.

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22          Hydro did not provide a response to CA 80 NLH (h) since the requested  
23          information was considered to be included in the detailed sales revenue per  
24          kWh provided in CA 80 NLH (g).

<p>* In 1998 Hydro's purchases of secondary energy increased from Abitibi Consolidated due to a shutdown of newsprint production as a result of a labour strike. This energy was subject to deferred accounting in case Hydro subsequently spilled energy from its own reservoirs, which did occur in the spring of 1999.</p>
