A. The scope of work will be used to prepare a contract which will be issued to engineering companies which will submit proposals to perform the work. The successful bidder will perform the assessment study. The level of assessment for some components, particularly auxiliary equipment, cannot be determined until the study is in progress. For instance, units 1 and 2 have a total of four 1,500 horsepower forced draft fans. If it was decided to completely dismantle one fan for detailed inspection and it was discovered that it is in excellent condition, Hydro would probably perform only a visual inspection of the other three fans. However, if small cracks are discovered in the fan shaft (axle), it is likely that Hydro would perform detailed inspections
