"Oil Insulated Switch Parts Purchase Release"

Newfoundland Light & Power Co. Limited (hereafter referred to as the user) has issued to Canada Power Products Corporation (hereafter referred to as CPPC), a Purchase Order, Number: 28141 dated July 28, 1998 requesting CPPC to sell oil switch parts in order to replace like parts on existing non-spring - assisted oil switches.

CPPC strongly recommends replacing these oil insulated switches with spring assisted oil switches recently quoted on Bid C98-47.

CPPC strongly recommends that the existing oil switches only be operated remotely via rope and pulley.

In consideration of CPPC continuing to supply oil switch parts when requested by the User, the User agrees to the following:

The User agrees to perform yearly maintenance, or more frequently as required, per the following instructions:

"RA" Oil Switches

GW-503-2

January 1973

The User agrees to commence a replacement program to eliminate five (5) non-spring assisted oil switches over the next five (5) years with the remaining eight (8) units to be replaced as part of a future program.

It is the intention of both the User and CPPC that CPPC, its officers, agents and employees shall not be liable or in any way responsible for damage, loss or expense resulting to User, its employees, agents, representatives, or anyone else due to accidents, mishaps or injuries either to person or property or of any nature to person or property of any kind caused in any manner by the continued use of these oil switches.

User assumes the risk of all damage, loss, costs and expense and agrees to indemnify and hold harmless CPPC, its officers, agents and employees from and against any and all liability, damage, loss, cost and expense which may accrue to or be sustained by CPPC, its officers, agents, or employees arising from the death or injury to persons or destruction of property caused in any manner by the continued use of these switches and their extension of product life by applying aforementioned replacement parts.

Dear Mr. Norman:

Canada Power Products purchased the G&W Oil Switchgear product line. We manufacture spring assisted switches and supply necessary replacement parts. As for non-spring assisted switchgear, Canada Power Products Corp. and G&W have spent several years discussing with Newfoundland Power the need to replace this outdated and obsolete equipment.

It is our corporate policy not to supply any component parts for non-spring assisted switches. These switches are considered dangerous having no close into fault rating or spring assisted contacts. This equipment is approximately 30 years old and beyond its life expectancy.

We will be happy to assist Newfoundland Power with replacing this obsolete equipment with new switches. The standard potheads supplied are cast aluminum bodies but we can also offer bronze bodies as an option if this will better suit Newfoundland Powers' requirements.


Dear Mr. Hoff:

1. As we spoke already we need to know if the customer wants 42" or 48" frame height? →
2. Also, we need to know if the customer wants the portable controller with or without battery backup.
If they choose with battery backup they need to maintain the battery life and they cannot use an external power source.
If they choose without battery backup they must have a 120VAC power supply to use the controller.
3. Out of the (5) serial numbers provided we believe only two of them were valid numbers, 3987 and 3939. The other 3 numbers provided, we believe from our records, belong to different customers. Therefore we can only 100% confirm the cableheads we are supplying are correct for the first two numbers. Based on the descriptive details on the customer's p.o., we believe all the cableheads on their existing equipment should be the same but in the event they have something in the field that is different we will not accept the responsibility for supplying the wrong replacement parts.

We require the above information to proceed with this order. Please advise promptly as I am racing against the clock to order these parts to arrive on time for a December shipment.
