**AN ORDER OF THE BOARD**

1 **IN THE MATTER OF** the **Petroleum**  
2 **Products Act**, SNL 2001, Chapter P-10.1  
3 and regulations thereunder; and  
4

5 **IN THE MATTER OF** a request from the Minister  
6 pursuant to Section 8.1(3) of the **Petroleum**  
7 **Products Act** to review the suitability of the  
8 pricing mechanism for benchmark prices and  
9 the maximum mark-up between the wholesale  
10 price to the retailer and the retail price to the  
11 consumer for all regulated fuels; and

13 **IN THE MATTER OF** the retail maximum price  
14 for stove oil heating fuel chargeable by Black  
15 Tickle Convenience and Gas Inc. in Zone 11a -  
16 Coastal Labrador South.

19 **WHEREAS** on June 7, 2022, pursuant to Section 8.1(3) of the **Petroleum Products Act**, the  
20 Minister of Digital Government and Service NL requested that the Board review the suitability  
21 of the pricing mechanism for benchmark prices and the maximum mark-up between the  
22 wholesale price to the retailer and the retail price to the consumer for all regulated fuels; and  
23

24 **WHEREAS** as part of the Petroleum Products Pricing Review (the "Review") the Board engaged  
25 consultants and sought information and feedback from the industry, consumers and  
26 community groups; and  
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28 **WHEREAS** on October 1, 2024 the Board issued a consultation document for industry and public  
29 input which outlined potential changes to benchmarking, mark-ups and zone differentials, and  
30 other pricing matters, for Labrador; and

32 **WHEREAS** on March 13, 2025, the Board issued a final report for Labrador which outlined in  
33 detail the changes to petroleum products pricing to be implemented in Labrador, including the  
34 Board's rationale and implementation plan for those changes; and

1 **WHEREAS** the Board considered all information and feedback provided by its consultants, the  
2 industry, consumers and community groups during the Review and concluded that for  
3 Labrador, among other items, increases to the retail mark-ups for gasoline and stove oil heating  
4 fuel in all Labrador zones are warranted and that these changes should be phased-in over  
5 several weeks; and


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7 **WHEREAS** Order No. P.P. 22(2025) approved new retail maximum prices that could be charged  
8 by Black Tickle Convenience and Gas Inc. in Zone 11a - Coastal Labrador South for stove oil  
9 heating fuel of 163.50 cents per litre, exclusive of applicable taxation, effective March 28, 2025  
10 until further order of the Board; and

11  
12 **WHEREAS** the Board is satisfied that the retail mark-up changes flowing from the Review are  
13 applicable to Black Tickle Convenience and Gas Inc. and that the retail maximum prices for  
14 stove oil heating fuel approved pursuant to Order No. P.P. 22(2025) should be adjusted  
15 accordingly; and



17 **WHEREAS** the Board finds that a retail maximum price for stove oil heating fuel of up to 164.49  
18 cents per litre, excluding applicable taxes, should be established for Black Tickle Convenience  
19 and Gas Inc. in Zone 11a - Coastal Labrador South.

21 **IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED THAT:**  
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23 1. Black Tickle Convenience and Gas Inc. can charge a retail maximum price of up to 164.49  
24 cents per litre, taxes excluded, for stove oil heating fuel in Zone 11a - Coastal Labrador  
25 South, effective 12:01 a.m., Friday, April 4, 2025, until further Order of the Board.


