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33	WHEREAS the Applicant is a corporation duly organized and existing under the laws of the
34	Province of Newfoundland and Labrador, is a public utility within the meaning of the Act, and is
35	also subject to the provisions of the Electrical Power Control Act, 1994; and

1 WHEREAS a number of Domestic Customers with residences located in a Cottage Area near the 2 Community of Howley have requested that the Applicant provide their residences with single-phase 3 electrical service and provision of the requested service requires that the Applicant construct 4 approximately 48,868 metres of single-phase line (the "Extension"); and 5 6 WHEREAS these Customers have requested the Non-Refundable CIAC Option provided for in 7 Clause 6 of the CIAC Policy: Distribution Line Extensions to Domestic Customers approved by 8 Order No. P.U. 27 (2005), dated November 2, 2005; and 9 10 WHEREAS the CIAC Policy provides that the minimum participation percentage necessary to avail 11 of the Non-Refundable CIAC Option is 50%, effectively requiring that at least 208 out of the 415 12 Customers in the Howley Cottage Area must pay at least the minimum downpayment on their Non-13 Refundable CIAC; and 14 15 WHEREAS on May 23, 2006 the Applicant made application to the Board requesting approval of a 16 CIAC of Three thousand four hundred five dollars and seventy-seven cents (\$3,405.77), including 17 HST, for each customer, and by Order No. P.U. 18(2006) dated June 12, 2006 the Board approved 18 the CIAC Application; and 19 20 WHEREAS at the time the original CIAC Application was submitted, 208 of the potential 415 21 Customers in the area had provided the Applicant with written confirmation that they would accept 22 electrical service and pay the required CIAC; and

- 1 **WHEREAS** as of July 6, 2006 the Applicant has received written confirmation from 212 Customers
- 2 that they will accept service and pay the approved CIAC but only 204 Customers, or 49% of the total
- 3 number of customers, had paid the minimum downpayment; and

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- 5 **WHEREAS** the Applicant has stated it is unlikely it will receive the minimum downpayment from
- 6 208 Customers in time to enable the Applicant to complete construction in this year; and

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- 8 **WHEREAS** the Applicant, pursuant to S. iv(ii) of the CIAC Policy requests the Board approve a
- 9 Non-Refundable CIAC of \$3,405.77 including HST for each customer of the Cottage Area based on
- the participation of 49% of the customers; and
- 11 **WHEREAS** the Board is satisfied that approval of the Application as a deviation from the CIAC
- 12 Policy is reasonable in the circumstances.
