**AN ORDER OF THE BOARD**

**NO. P.U. 26(2023)**

1 **IN THE MATTER OF** the **Electrical Power**  
2 **Control Act, 1994**, SNL 1994, Chapter E-5.1  
3 (the “**EPCA**”) and the **Public Utilities Act**, RSNL  
4 1990, Chapter P-47 (the “**Act**”), as amended,  
5 and regulations thereunder; and

7 **IN THE MATTER OF** an application by  
8 Newfoundland Power Inc. for approval of a  
9 Contribution in Aid of Construction for  
10 a single-phase extension to the Northbrook Road  
11 cottage area, pursuant to section 41 of the **Act**.

14 **WHEREAS** Newfoundland Power Inc. (“Newfoundland Power”) is a corporation duly organized  
15 and existing under the laws of the Province of Newfoundland and Labrador, is a public utility  
16 within the meaning of the **Act**, and is also subject to the provisions of the **EPCA**; and  
17

18 **WHEREAS** on September 20, 2023 Newfoundland Power filed an application for approval of a  
19 Contribution in Aid of Construction (“CIAC”) for a single-phase extension of approximately 1,115  
20 metres (the “Extension”) to serve nine (9) Domestic customers located in a cottage area known  
21 as Northbrook Road in Gallants; and  
22

23 **WHEREAS** the CIAC, calculated in accordance with Clause 5(a) of the CIAC Policy: Distribution Line  
24 Extensions to Domestic Customers approved by Order No. P.U. 27(2005) (the “Policy”) is five  
25 thousand six hundred seventeen dollars and twenty-two cents (\$5,617.22), excluding HST; and

27 **WHEREAS** the sum of the CIAC calculated pursuant to Clause 5(a) and the Basic Investment  
28 calculated pursuant to Clause 3 is \$50,555.00; and  
29

30 **WHEREAS** Clause 10(i) of the Policy states that approval of the Board is required where the sum  
31 of the CIAC calculated pursuant to Clauses 5(a) or 6(a) and the Basic and Additional Investment  
32 calculated pursuant to Clauses 3 and 4 are estimated to be greater than \$50,000; and

1 **WHEREAS** the proposed CIAC is necessary to ensure that Newfoundland Power’s investment in  
2 the Extension is compensatory over the useful life of the Extension and will not be to the  
3 detriment of its other customers.


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6 **IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED THAT:**


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- 8 1. The Refundable Contribution in Aid of Construction of five thousand six hundred seventeen  
9 dollars and twenty-two cents (\$5,617.22), excluding HST, to apply to Domestic customers  
10 located in the Northbrook Road cottage area in Gallants, is approved.

12 2. Newfoundland Power Inc. shall pay all expenses of the Board arising from this Application.
