AN ORDER OF THE BOARD

1 **IN THE MATTER OF** the **Electrical Power**
2 **Control Act, 1994**, SNL 1994, Chapter E-5.1
3 (the “**EPCA**”) and the **Public Utilities Act**,
4 RSNL 1990, Chapter P-47 (the “**Act**”), as
5 amended, and regulations thereunder; and

7 **IN THE MATTER OF** an application by
8 Newfoundland and Labrador Hydro for approval
9 of a Contribution in Aid of Construction for a
10 single-phase extension to a water treatment
11 building in the Town of L’Anse Au Clair, pursuant
12 to section 41 of the **Act**.

15 **WHEREAS** Newfoundland and Labrador Hydro (“Hydro”) is a corporation continued and existing
16 under the **Hydro Corporation Act, 2007**, is a public utility within the meaning of the **Act**, and is
17 also subject to the provisions of the **EPCA**; and

19 **WHEREAS** on November 22, 2023 Hydro filed an application for approval of a Contribution in Aid
20 of Construction (“CIAC”) for a single-phase extension of 1,500 metres to allow permanent
21 electrical service to a water treatment building in the Town of L’Anse Au Clair; and

23 **WHEREAS** the CIAC, calculated in accordance with Clause 5(a) of the CIAC Policy: Distribution Line
24 Extensions and Upgrades to General Service Customers approved by Order No. P.U. 27(2005) (the
25 “Policy”), is sixty-five thousand two hundred and seventy-five dollars (\$65,275.00), excluding
26 HST; and
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
28 **WHEREAS** Clause 10(i) of the Policy states that the company shall apply to the Board for approval
29 of all line extensions or upgrades involving CIACs where the costs calculated pursuant to Clause
30 5(a) are estimated to be greater than \$50,000; and

32 **WHEREAS** the proposed CIAC is necessary to ensure that Hydro’s investment is compensatory
33 over the useful life of the extension and will not be to the detriment of its other customers.

1 **IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED THAT:**

- 3 1. The Contribution in Aid of Construction of sixty-five thousand two hundred and seventy-
4 five dollars (\$65,275.00), excluding HST, to be charged to the Town of L'Anse Au Clair, to
5 provide single-phase permanent electrical service to its water treatment building is
6 approved.

8 2. Newfoundland and Labrador Hydro shall pay all expenses of the Board arising from this
9 Application.
