Q. (Reference 2017 GRA Volume II, Exhibit 2, page 4) It is stated (lines 19 to 22) "The

NLSO is also responsible for offering open and non-discriminatory access to the

Newfoundland and Labrador interconnected transmission system to all transmission

customers, including Nalcor affiliates and non-affiliated third parties." Name these

non-affiliated third parties. How would CBPP be allowed to buy and sell power

under an open access regime?

A. The non-affiliated third parties have not been identified but they could include any party that wishes to avail of the province's transmission system and is determined to be an eligible transmission customer.

Any party, including CBPP, that wishes to avail of transmission services in the Province, will be able to apply to the Newfoundland and Labrador System Operator (NLSO) to become an eligible customer and request transmission service under the set of standard rules included in the Newfoundland and Labrador transmission policies and procedures. These rules will explicitly provide for the provision of transmission service on an open and non-discriminatory basis and upon rates and terms that will be available and approved by the Board. However, section 14.1 of the *Electrical Power Control Act, 1994* would prevent CBPP from purchasing power from any party other than Hydro for the supply of electric energy supporting its operations on the island portion of the province, or selling to other island customers.
