Q. (Reference response to NP-NLH-6) Based on this response, it appears that
customers will be informed of rate impacts resulting from the Muskrat Falls project
after the project is complete, rate impacts are understood and rate mitigation has
been decided. Does Hydro consider it fair to customers to inform them after-thefact rather than in advance to allow them time to mitigate rate increases through
conservation, fuel switching, net metering, etc?

Α.

Impacts of the Muskrat Falls Project on electricity rates have been widely communicated and publicly discussed in the province since the project began. While the precise impact of project costs on electricity rates are not yet known, Nalcor Energy and the Government of Newfoundland and Labrador have consistently acknowledged potential rate increases for customers, as well as the need to identify an appropriate approach to mitigate impacts when Muskrat Falls is operational. Similarly, Hydro has reiterated potential rate increases for customers resulting from the project. This is evident in recent public messaging related to the current rate application and, specifically, in a news release issued on July 28, 2017, in which Hydro noted:

It is well known that Muskrat Falls will have a significant impact on electricity rates. To help offset future rate impacts for customers, the application proposes that any savings gained by bringing less-expensive power to the island on new transmission lines from Labrador, or Nova Scotia, be set aside and given back to customers in future rates when Muskrat Falls comes into service.
