Please also confirm that IFRS prohibits recording of cost of removal outside of Asset Retirement Obligations (AROs).

- A. This response has been provided by Concentric Advisors:
 - IFRS 14 (IN1) IFRS 14 Regulatory Deferral Accounts. This Standard
 describes regulatory deferral account balances as amounts of expense or
 income that would not be recognized as assets or liabilities in accordance
 with other standards, but that qualify to be deferred in accordance with this
 standard because the amount is included, or is expected to be included, by
 the rate regulator in establishing the prices(s) that an entity can charge to
 customers for rate-regulated goods or services.
 - IFRS 14 (B6) Regulatory deferral account balances usually represent timing differences between the recognition of income or expenses for regulatory purposes and the recognition of those items for financial disclosure purposes.
 - IFRS 14 (BC50) this standard requires the disclosure of qualitative and quantitative information for each type of an entity's rate-regulated activities and each class of regulatory deferral account balance, because this will

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1	provide information that is more useful in assessing the impact of different
2	rate-regulatory environments.

4	In order to meet the above requirement which indicates that the regulatory deferral
5	amounts must be specific to each deferral, Concentric Advisors specifically identify the
6	portion of the depreciation rate that is applicable to cost of removal in order that the
7	related deferral account can be tracked.
