

1 Q. Please refer to NLH’s response to RFI IC-NLH-008. In hydraulic production, is the  
2 complete generator considered the retirement unit and capitalized when placed  
3 into service and retired when removed from service? Are the components of  
4 rotors, stators, and stator windings considered separate retirement units and  
5 capitalized when placed into service and retired when removed from service or are  
6 they considered minor items of property?

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9 A. In accordance with Hydro’s capitalization policy, the rotor, stators, and stator  
10 winding components of a generator are considered separate units. These  
11 components are capitalized when placed into service and are retired when removed  
12 from service.
