11		"The NLSO will reside in Hydro but will be functionally		
12		separate and will act as the independent system operator		
13		for the transmission system in the Province. It will operate		
14		the facilities owned by Hydro and Nalcor along with		
15		interconnections to Emera's Maritime Link assets on the		
16		island."

18		"Hydro has structured the NLSO into three main areas:		
19		Transmission Planning, System Operations, and Reliability		
20		and Commercial Management:

22		"Transmission Planning – The transmission planning group		
23		is responsible for the safe, efficient, reliable, and		
24		environmentally responsible planning of the provincial		
25		interconnected transmission system.

1			"System Operations – The System Operations group
2			manages the Newfoundland and Labrador power system
3			and coordinates the supply of and demand for electricity

9			operating the bulk electrical system. The NLSO is also
10			responsible for offering open and non-discriminatory

13			including Nalcor affiliates and non-affiliated third parties."

16		b)	Is it already in existence and already carrying out these functions?
17		c)	If so, was it created in response to directives from either the provincial
18			government or the PUB, or purely as an initiative of NLH?
19		d)	If the NLSO is not already in existence and already carrying out these
20			functions, is Hydro awaiting authorization to do so from the PUB in the
21			context of the present proceeding?

25		b)	The NLSO has commenced separate functional operations within Hydro;
26			however, it will not be fully operational until the procedures are in place
27			with respect to open access.

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1	c)	It was created by Hydro in consultation with the provincial government.
2		
3	d)	The NLSO does not require the authority of the Board to carry out all of its
4		functions—some of them it can carry out by agreement with the
5		transmission owners—but it will need rates approved to enable it to charge
6		a transmission rate, including an open access tariff.
