A. Mr. Doug Bowman confirms that proposed rates to be charged to Hydro's Rural customers are consistent with OC2017-121 and that they will be materially below the rates that would fully recover the cost of providing service to these customers. As stated by Hydro (Application Volume 1 (rev. 3), page 5.31, lines 16 - 17) "Hydro's rates for Rural Customers on the Island Interconnected and L'Anse au Loup Systems are the same as the rates charged to Newfoundland Power customers." Therefore, if Newfoundland Power rates were set at levels above the cost of supply as proposed by Hydro, rates for Rural customers would collect more than they would if Newfoundland Power rates were set at levels that reflected the cost of supply. Further, as pointed out in the same paragraph in Mr. Doug Bowman's pre-filed evidence (page 17), proposing rates for Newfoundland Power that would collect more than the cost of supply, while proposing rates for Labrador Interconnected Customers that would collect the cost of supply, would result in an inappropriate amount of the rural subsidy being allocated to Newfoundland Power. To be specific, Mr. Doug Bowman recommends that Newfoundland Power rates be set at levels reflecting the cost of supply.
