1	Q.	Further to the response to PUB-NLH-064 which states that there is no calculation
2		underlying the productivity allowance, how did the executive determine the
3		appropriate amount for this "self-imposed target"?
4		
5		
6	A.	The budgets for the 2018 and 2019 Test Years were based on requirements to
7		support work plans and activities for those years. Initiatives that have been
8		identified to provide cost reductions are described in Hydro's response to PUB-NLH
9		122. Hydro Executive determined that based upon the cost management actions
10		planned for 2018, a \$1 million productivity allowance was included as a means to
11		quantify the impact of the various initiatives. The productivity amount was also
12		applied for the 2019 Test Year.
13		
14		Please note that that the \$1 million productivity allowance is in addition to Hydro's
15		commitment to holding flat on FTEs as noted in Hydro's response to PUB-NLH-033,
16		lines 15-17, which includes the absorption of six positions in the Energy Control
17		Centre and the \$3.5 million vacancy allowance.
