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Order in Council OC2013-343 requires that the cost of supply from the Muskrat Falls Project (including the LIL and the LTA) be recovered in full through Island Interconnected rates charged to the appropriate classes of ratepayers. In Brattle's view, what implications does OC2013-343 have with regards to Hydro's Cost of Service and the inclusion of costs of the LIL and LTA in Hydro's Open Access Transmission Tariff?

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8 First, the cost of service studies aims at assigning costs to rate classes on the basis A. 9 of cost causality. How that cost of service is translated into rates is not an issue that Brattle has been asked to opine on. The cost of service only binds the rate designer 10 11 to a particular rate design and level to the extent that the rate designer hews to the 12 principle of cost causality in the rate design. Second, our recommendation for 13 including the LIL and LTA in Hydro's OATT results from the practice for most 14 utilities and for all ISOs/RTOs in the U.S. that lines of their size and type are 15 inherently part of the transmission system. See also our responses to NP-PUB-009 16 and LAB-PUB-001.
