Would the development of a 8 similar network additions policy for the IIS mitigate any potential inconsistencies? 9 10 11 A. Newfoundland and Labrador Hydro's proposed approach is consistent with the "NL 12 Transmission Policies and Procedures," approved by the Board of Commissioners of Public 13 Utilities in Order No. P.U. 3(2018), for both the Labrador Interconnected System and the Island Interconnected System. Therefore, Newfoundland and Labrador Hydro is required to 14 15 apply the same approach in determining a contribution from a Newfoundland and Labrador 16 System Operator Transmission Customer on the Island Interconnected System as it applies 17 for the Labrador Interconnected System. 18 19 The "NL Transmissions Policies and Procedures" ensure there is consistency in the 20 treatment of all Newfoundland and Labrador System Operator Transmission Customers. 21 Therefore, a separate Network Additions Policy for the Island Interconnected System is not 22 required to provide open, non-discriminatory and non-preferential access to transmission 23 service on the Newfoundland and Labrador Interconnected System.
