3		It seems that Hydro believes that industrial customers are less likely to relocate than non-
4		industrial customers. Please confirm. If the answer is yes, please provide the evidence, data,
5		support for Hydro's belief.

7		
8	A.	Yes, Newfoundland and Labrador Hydro ("Hydro") believes that industrial customers in
9		Labrador are less likely to relocate than non-industrial customers in Labrador.
10		
11		The proposed "Network Additions Policy – Labrador Interconnected System" defines an
12		industrial customer as: " a Customer in Labrador who is served at Transmission
13		Voltage; whose Peak Demand is 5,000 kW or more; and whose line of business is
14		principally related to Industrial Development." ¹
15		
16		Industrial Development is defined in the "Network Additions Policy – Labrador Interconnected
17		System as " all actions involved in the manufacture, assembly or processing of tangible
18		merchandise, or the extraction or processing of raw materials." ²
19		
20		Most industrial customers will require the natural resources in Labrador to continue operations
21		Given the expected reliance of industrial customers on the natural resources in Labrador and
22		the availability of a very low-cost, non-regulated electricity rate for generation costs (slightly
23		more than 2 cents per kWh), Hydro believes industrial customers that are or become
24		established in Labrador are less likely to relocate than non-industrial customers.
