## 2 Replacement - Cat Arm

Q. NLH states that the closure of the accommodations at the Cat Arm site has
affected the budget associated with the replacement of the governor controls
for Unit #2 at Cat Arm. It is estimated that a further \$263,000 will be
incurred, exclusive of accommodations.

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a) Did NLH explore the possibility of introducing temporary and/or mobile structures as a potential lesser cost alternative?

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12 Α. a) Yes, Hydro explored the possibility of introducing temporary and/or mobile 13 structures as a potential lesser cost alternative. While planning this project, 14 several local companies and some eastern Canadian companies were 15 contacted in an effort to reduce the overall total project cost. Suitable 16 temporary and/or mobile accommodations large enough for the number of 17 crew on site were not available. Accommodations that were available 18 required significant amounts of repair/alterations before they could be 19 transported to the site and set up for overnight accommodations. In addition, 20 Hydro would incur labor and material costs to provide required services such 21 as water and electricity once the structures arrived on site. Rental costs in 22 addition to the costs discussed above determined that mobile and/or 23 temporary accommodations that meet reasonable standards were not 24 feasible.
