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1 Q. Please provide an outline, giving dates and descriptions of the efforts made, of the
2 discussions that have been held with the Industrial Customers and with
3 Newfoundland Power in an effort to modify the Rate Stabilization Plan to meet the
4 changing conditions in the Newfoundland and Labrador market.

A.

Discussions with the Industrial Customers, Newfoundland Power and the Consumer Advocate were held throughout 2007 and 2008 concerning potential re-designs to the Rate Stabilization Plan (RSP). The first meetings, March 19-21, 2007 included a discussion on the allocation of the RSP load variation; however, it was not in the context of modifying the RSP to meet the changing conditions in the Newfoundland and Labrador market. At that point, the Stephenville pulp and paper mill had closed, a new test year (2007) had been set, and no additional significant load changes were anticipated. By the time of the next significant load change in the fall of 2008, the RSP discussions had stalled, and the possible implications of new International Financial Reporting Standards (IFRS) needed to be analyzed. Hydro has not engaged its customers in subsequent discussion concerning agreement to modify the RSP for changing market conditions.
