4	A.	The Energy Conservation and Efficiency Partnership (the "ECEP") is a coordinative
5		body for provincial energy conservation and efficiency initiatives. Current members
6		include: the Provincial Departments of Natural Resources, Environment and
7		Conservation, and Transportation and Works; as well as Newfoundland and Labrador
8		Hydro ("Hydro") and Newfoundland Power.
9		
10		Until the third quarter of 2008, the ECEP functioned on an <i>ad hoc</i> basis. In October
11 12		2008, Mr. Lorne Henderson was designated as Newfoundland Power's representative on the ECEP. The Assistant Deputy Minister of Energy Policy, Department of Natural
13		Resources, chairs the ECEP.
14		Resources, chans the LeLi.
15		The ECEP has met approximately ten times in 2008 and 2009.
16		
17		The ECEP provides a forum for sharing information on conservation planning and
18		practices. For example, the joint Newfoundland Power and Hydro Energy Conservation
19		Potential Study and the Five-Year Conservation Plan were circulated to all participants.
20		
21		The ECEP has enabled coordination of public energy conservation programming, such as
22		the Province's <i>EnerGuide</i> program, which was launched in December 2008. This
23		coordination includes ensuring consistent consumer information is made available about
24		the program by all ECEP participants. Further coordination is expected but specific
25		details are currently uncertain.
