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In Section 3.2 of the Evidence it is stated that no attachment rental fees will be paid Q. by either Newfoundland Power or Bell Aliant under the proposed 2011 Joint Use Agreement. Provide financial analysis of estimated attachment rentals due from each party over the initial five-year term of the Agreement to support this statement.

A pro-forma financial analysis of estimated attachment rentals which would be due from Newfoundland Power and Bell Aliant over the five year term of the 2011 Joint Use Agreement is detailed in Table 1.

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14 15 The estimated net attachment rental amount which would be due from Newfoundland Power and Bell Aliant is zero. This reflects the Joint Use cost sharing principle that there should be no economic advantage to either owners or tenants of Support Structures.

The calculation of the 2011 total annual cost per pole of \$95.46 is found in Table 1 of the Response to Request for Information PUB-NP-46. 40% of this amount, or \$38.18, represents Bell Aliant's portion of the 2011 total annual cost of a Joint Use Support Structure.

The calculation of the 2011 total annual cost per pole of \$95.46 is found in Table 1 of the Response to Request for Information PUB-NP-46. 60% of this amount, or \$57.27, represents Newfoundland Power's portion of the 2011 total annual cost of a Joint Use Support Structure.
