The ownership of the Joint Use Support Structure involved in a customer trouble call has no impact on Newfoundland Power's Level 1 or Level 2 response.² The Company's pool of resources used to provide Level 1 or Level 2 response is sized to respond to the volume of trouble on the *electricity* system. The sale of Joint Use Support Structures to Bell Aliant has no material implications for the volume of trouble on the electricity system.³

If the facility that is damaged is a Joint Use Support Structure, then the partner, Bell Aliant, will dispatch its pole setting contractor

For example, Newfoundland Power would dispatch a trouble crew to all pole fires, whether the Support Structure is owned by the Company or by Bell Aliant.

In a typical year, over 99% of customer trouble calls that Newfoundland Power responds to do not require the replacement of Support Structures. Please refer to the Response to Request for Information PUB-NP-38, Page 2, line 9 to Page 3, line 3.
