Q. With reference to the Project **D-265, Remove Safety Hazards**, provide the specific justification for and detailed breakdown of the \$144,317 expenditure for "Highway signs to meet Occupational Health and Safety Traffic Control while working on highway."

A. As a result of new traffic control legislation in the province effective January 1, 2011
Hydro was required to purchase road signs in order to comply with guidelines in the
Traffic Control Manual published by the Department of Transportation and Works.
Occupational Health and Safety (OH and S) Regulations require that traffic control
procedures shall at minimum meet the requirements of the Department of
Transportation and Works "Traffic Control Manual for Roadway Work Operations"

or procedures established by a municipality that have been approved by the

minister and all relevant specifications".

A breakdown of the \$144,317 expenditure for "Highway signs to meet Occupational Health and Safety Traffic Control while working on highway" is presented in the table below. The number and type of signs required varies from region to region. The unit cost varies depending on the specific type of sign purchased.
