Q. 1 Reference: Front End Engineering Design, Volume I, Page D-231 2 3 Is it Hydro's view that Section 41 of the Public Utilities Act requires that advance approval of the Board be obtained before Hydro can conduct detailed engineering 4 5 for capital work? If so, please provide a detailed explanation of the basis for this 6 view. 7 8 9 A. Section 41 of the Public Utilities Act states that "a public utility shall submit an 10 annual capital budget of proposed improvements or additions to its property to the Board for its approval not later than December 15 in each year for the next calendar 11 year." It also states that "the budget shall contain an estimate of future required 12 13 expenditures on improvements or additions to the property of the public utility that 14 will not be completed in the next calendar year" and that "a public utility shall not 15 proceed with the construction, purchase or lease of improvements or additions to 16 its property where: 17 (a) the cost of the construction or purchase is in excess of \$50,000; or 18 19 (b) the cost of the lease is in excess of \$5,000 in a year of the lease without the prior 20 approval of the board." 21 22 As the Phase 1 engineering costs are a portion of the total construction costs of 23 improvements or additions to capital property, Board approval is required for this expenditure. It is Hydro's view that approval should be sought from the Board for 24 25 these costs with the Capital Budget submission for the year in which the costs are 26 to be incurred.
