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- Q. Hydro states in NP-NLH-401 "Newfoundland Power's approach to allocation of the rural deficit among its classes is comparable to the revenue requirement approach proposed by Hydro". Does Newfoundland Power agree with this statement?

 A. No. Newfoundland Power does not agree with the statement. Newfoundland Power
- A. No. Newfoundland Power does not agree with the statement. Newfoundland Power allocates the Rural Deficit among its classes proportionally based on the total cost of service for each class (excluding Rate Stabilization Account adjustments and the Municipal Tax adjustment).

Although the method for allocating the Rural Deficit among Newfoundland Power's classes of customers is essentially a "revenue requirement approach", the purpose for which it is used differs from the purpose of the revenue requirement approach proposed by Hydro for allocating the Rural Deficit.

Newfoundland Power's methodology allocates its portion of the Rural Deficit within a single system based on a single cost of service study and relatively uniform rates within the classes. The purpose of Hydro's proposed methodology, on the other hand, is to allocate the Rural Deficit between two systems that are considered separately for cost of service purposes. In Mr. Brockman's opinion, a methodology for allocating the Rural Deficit between different systems should account for differences in the circumstances and characteristics of the customers on the different systems.
