Q. Page 3, lines 59-60 states: "Specifically: a) total energy costs are high, much higher than for residents elsewhere in the province." Does Mr. Henderson's statement take into consideration the Northern Strategic Plan subsidy provided for electrical usage to Domestic Customers on the Labrador Isolated Systems? If yes, please provide support for the quoted statement.

A.

As stated in the Expert Report submitted by the Nunatsiavut Government, any consideration of electricity rate increases needs to weigh the social and economic consequences of comprehensive and inclusive energy costs encountered by Nunatsiavut residents and businesses. Even after the net impact of the Northern Strategic Plan subsidy is factored into residential/business electricity costs; the impact of: a) northern climate conditions, b) heating costs, and, c) higher energy costs raising the costs of essentials like food is onerous. Thus the Expert Report states that the total energy costs (i.e. electricity, heat, and energy costs impacts on essentials) are: "... high, much higher than for residents elsewhere in the province". That is a fact, even after consideration of the Northern Strategic Plan subsidy.
