Q. Page 12 states "The Unit Cost Method is consistent with the allocation of costs within a system which are typically shared equally depending on the customer use of peak demand (i.e. \$/kW), the customer use of energy (i.e. \$/kWh) and equal allocation of customer-related costs to customers (i.e. \$/customer)." Please explain the \$/customer approach employed in the Rural Deficit allocation methodology and Mr. Brockman's view of the appropriateness of the number of customers for each system used in the calculation.

A. The \$/customer approach employed in the existing Rural Deficit allocation methodology is used to allocate costs between Hydro's customer, Newfoundland Power, and Hydro's rural Labrador Interconnected System. It does not allocate costs between Newfoundland Power's customers and Hydro's rural Labrador Interconnected System customers.

The method determines an equivalent number of customers represented by the specifically assigned customer-related charges to Newfoundland Power and Hydro's rural Labrador Interconnected System customers.² This is a proxy number of customers for purposes of allocation of \$/customer costs.

The equivalent number of customers for Newfoundland Power is determined by dividing the customer-related charges specifically assigned to Newfoundland Power by the average customer-related costs per Hydro's rural *Island* interconnected customer. As applied to rural Labrador Interconnected customers, the method results in a total equivalent number of customers equal to the actual total number of rural *Labrador* Interconnected customers.

Mr. Brockman believes that, in the context of allocating the \$/customer cost between Labrador Interconnected customers and Newfoundland Power, the calculation of a proxy equivalent number of customers for Newfoundland Power is a reasonable approach.
