Q. Could you please clarify the portion(s) of the \$6.3 million increase in professional services between 2013 and 2014 Test Year that Vale recommends the Board examines further. As noted in V-NLH-095, the following were the variances provided by Hydro:

- "An increase of \$2.3 million of GRA and Board related costs associated with an increased volume of application and regulatory activity; and an increase in consulting costs of \$4.0 million: \$2.0 million mainly due to the outage inquiry, \$1.1 million due to condition assessments and engineering related activities, \$0.6 million due to environmental work and safety and health related programs and \$0.3 million due to environmental remediation at Sunnyside Terminal Station".
- A. The response to V-NLH-095 lists five reasons for the increase in professional services of \$6.3 million between 2013 and 2014. I submit that all five of the increased costs should be examined further by the Board:
 - The largest is an increase of \$2.3 million of GRA and Board related costs associated with an increased volume of application and regulatory activity. As well as the on-going GRA, there were many applications that were directly related to the January 2014 power outages or followed as a consequence of the outages. The prudency of the capital expenditures are part of the Liberty Consulting mandate. An unknown portion of this \$2.3 million cost may be related to the work which Liberty will be giving an opinion about the prudency.
 - An increase is consulting costs of \$2.0 million mainly due to the outage inquiry. This \$2.0 million is directly related to the outage so the same concern as expressed in the bullet above applies in this case also.

1 A \$1.1 million increase in consulting due to condition assessments and 2 engineering related activities. This is an increase in 2014 over 2013 condition 3 assessment costs. They may be related to the applications that Liberty 4 Consulting are reviewing, so therefore brings in to consideration the prudency 5 of this \$1.1 million expenditure. An increase of \$0.6 million due to environmental work and safety and health 6 7 related programs. It is not clear if the increase in environment work is as a 8 result of the 2014 power outages and therefore should be examined further. 9

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 An increase in consulting services of \$0.3 million due to environmental remediation at the Sunnyside Terminal Station. If the extra remediation at the Sunnyside Terminal Station is due to the failures in this substation in January 2014, then the prudency of the expenditure is questionable.
