I evaluated the reasonableness of the methods used by Hydro and its affiliates to determine amounts to be charged for services rendered against the arm's length standard. The arm's length standard requires related parties to deal with each other as if they were dealing at arm's length. An arm's length party would not pay for a service unless the service was in some way beneficial to the recipient. With potentially a few minor exceptions, Hydro and its affiliates would have had to pay an independent enterprise for the inter-affiliate services they had received or would have performed the activity on their own behalf in-house. Consequently, by relying on the arm's length standard, I evaluated whether the inter-affiliate transactions provided a demonstrable benefit to Hydro and its affiliates and indirectly to ratepayers. I did not evaluate the effectiveness or efficiency with which Hydro and it affiliates rendered their services which might influence the quantum of the amounts charged.
