Provide more details on the 15% rate increase (deferred rate increase) that impacts rates for both rural Domestic and General Service Customers as referenced in the Application Section 4.4.2 Isolated Systems.

A.

Prior to Hydro's 2006 GRA, the policies for automatic rate changes for isolated systems did not permit passing on NP's Rate Stabilization Adjustment (RSA) or Municipal Tax Adjustments (MTA) for electricity consumption above the Lifeline Block for these customers. Given that there were no rate changes between test years, Hydro's final 2007 Test Year included a 15% rate increase relating to NP's RSA and MTA adjustments for the non-lifeline consumption for isolated systems. Since the previous GRA, the Government directed the deferral of the 2007 increase for this customer group by providing Hydro with a subsidy in the amount of the deferred rate increase for customers until an order is received from the PUB with respect to Hydro's next GRA, which is the current proceeding. Once a final order is received on Hydro's current GRA, the affected rates will equal what they would have been had the government directives not been issued.

As part of Hydro's last GRA in 2006, the issue of requiring periodic adjustments was addressed in the Parties' Agreement on COS, Rate Design, and Other Issues dated November 23, 2006, Section 10 which stated as follows:

It is recognized that some of Hydro's Isolated Rural customers are not subject to Newfoundland Power's Rate Stabilization Account (RSA) and Municipal Tax Adjustment (MTA) adjustments between Hydro GRAs. The Parties agree that in the future the rates for these Isolated Rural customers should be subject to periodic adjustments by Hydro to reflect Newfoundland Power's

1	periodic RSA and MTA adjustments, including any fuel rider adjustments. A
2	new provision reflecting this change will be included in revised Rules and
3	Regulations to be filed with the Board. The following rate classes will be
4	impacted:
5	a. Rural Isolated Domestic Customers (excluding Government Departments)
6	for consumption greater than the lifeline block;
7	b. Isolated Rural General Service Customers (excluding Government
8	Departments).

10	In its Order No. P.U. 8(2007), page 66, Section 16, the Board accepted the above
11	changes proposed by the Parties.
