3           Page 5, line 23 - Have the Bill Rates changed in the period 2007 to 2012? If yes,  
4           explain the changes in detail.

7    A.    Yes, Bill Rates have changed in the period 2007 to 2012. The Bill Rate is calculated  
8           based on two components—a salary cost component and fully loaded cost  
9           component. A change in either will affect the Bill Rate.

11           The salary cost component is calculated on the basis of pay scale. As such, the Bill  
12           Rate has changed in keeping with annual pay scale and collective agreement wage  
13           adjustments.

14

15           Hydro changed its fully loaded cost percentage from 42%to 57%<sup>1</sup> effective October  
16           1, 2009, as well as how it clustered its positions into pay groupings. Both had  
17           impacts on the Bill Rate.

18

19           On January 1, 2010, there was a change in the methodology used to derive the  
20           salary component of the Bill Rate. The salary component of Bill Rate would now be  
21           set using the job rate (100% of the salary or pay scale) for each specific pay group  
22           instead of an average of clustered pay groups. In addition, the available hours to  
23           work (i.e., billable hours) were used in the calculation of billing rate instead of  
24           standard hours. PUB-NLH-222 provides an explanation on how billing rates are  
25           calculated.

<sup>1</sup> The new percentage was based on a review of Hydro's three-year average labour cost and is more reflective of costs incurred.

Table 1 summarizes the dates and changes affecting the Bill Rate from 2007 to 2012.

April 1, 2007	Pay scale adjustment
October 1, 2009	Change in fully loaded cost percentage and how pay groups were clustered
January 1, 2010	Change in methodology for deriving salary component and change in bill rate calculation (using billable hours).
April 1, 2010	Pay scale adjustment
November 1, 2010	Pay scale adjustment
April 1, 2011	Pay scale adjustment
April 1, 2012	Pay scale adjustment
