Please refer to Hydro's response to IN-NLH-009 Attachment 2 for a detailed 9 description of the CDM programs included in the annual amounts provided in Hydro's response to PUB-NLH-406 Attachment 1. 10 11 These CDM programs benefit: (i) Newfoundland Power customers through reduced 12 13 fuel costs and a reduced rural deficit to be recovered through rates; (ii) Island 14 Industrial Customers through reduced fuel costs to be recovered through rates; and 15 (iii) Hydro Rural Labrador Interconnected customers through a lower rural deficit to 16 be recovered through rates. 17 The CDM program costs are recoverable by Newfoundland Power, Island Industrial 18 19 customers and Hydro Rural Island Interconnected customers based on percentages 20 of previous year calendar year sales as outlined in the Rates Schedules, CDM Cost 21 Recovery Adjustment, Page 18 and 19 of 46. The amounts initially allocated to 22 Hydro Rural Island Interconnected customers and the rural isolated system program 23 amounts are re-allocated to Newfoundland Power and Hydro Rural Labrador 24 Interconnected customers in the same proportion that the rural deficit was 25 allocated in the approved Test Year Cost of Service Study. The portion allocated to 26 the customers on the Labrador Interconnected System shall be written off to net 27 income.
