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4 With respect to common services that Hydro renders for its affiliates, it is Mr.
5 Rolph’s opinion that:

13 Did Mr. Rolph perform any comparative analysis to determine whether other
14 allocators, such as those listed in the Brad Rolph Evidence, page 23, Table 4,
15 might be more appropriate than the ones used by Hydro?
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18 A. Having satisfied myself that allocating the HR and Safety & Health-related costs to
19 be recovered using FTEs and allocating IS-related costs to be recovered using
20 average users was reasonable, I did not perform any comparative analysis to
21 determine whether other allocators, such as those listed in Table 4 on page 23 of
22 my report, might be more appropriate than the ones used by Hydro.
