Q. (Hydro Reply Evidence dated August 7, 2015, Section 10, Black Start) Please provide an analysis as to whether the diesel black start facility should be included in Hydro's rate base having regard to the used and useful criterion set out in the preamble to PR-CA-NLH-2.

A.

Hydro does not acknowledge that the "used and useful" criterion set out in the preamble to PR-CA-NLH-002 is appropriate. As noted in Hydro's response to PR-CA-NLH-002, this definition contains unquantified references to "significant operating levels" on a "consistent" and "sustainable" basis. Hydro understands the "used and useful" concept to more generally require that an asset currently provide or be capable of providing a utility service to customers. Further as noted in Bonbright, *Principles of Public Utility Rates*, at page 257 "a flexible 'used and useful' concept decided on a case-by-case basis has emerged".

With that clarification, Hydro confirms all components of the black start facility should be included in Hydro's rate base as the system has been in service, having proven its original function and provided the additional function of system support several times since it has been in service. This facility has been interconnected and available since April 4, 2014. If an event occurred that required a re-start of Holyrood using this facility, Hydro would have proceeded with using the facility at any date after April 4, 2014, and based on the subsequent successful test, the system would have functioned as designed. The facility was tested and successfully proven to re-start Holyrood on July 25, 2014. The facility was unable to be tested until after the 2014 heating season was over, because the test required that one thermal unit be turned off for the testing. Full commissioning of the black start

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capability occurred on July 25, 2014. The facility was also available for service to
the system as back up and for system demand purposes, starting October 17, 2014.
While the facility has not been required to be utilized to re-start Holyrood since it
has been in service, the facility has been used several times since winter 2014 for
system demand purposes, benefiting customers on the Island Interconnected
system, and has been available to re-start Holyrood as required. Therefore, the
facility is fully used and useful for the customers served by the Island
Interconnected system.
