c. All incidents are recorded in PREVENT (an internally-developed incident database) as soon as possible after the occurrence.

Injuries resulting in a full day absence from work.

Lost Time Frequency = Number of Lost Time Injuries per 200,000 hours worked.

Medical aid injuries are those that require treatment beyond first aid. For example, an injury requiring prescription medication would be classified as a medical aid injury, whereas an injury requiring only non-prescription medication would be classified as a first aid injury.

The Company also captures data for periodic review regarding first aid injuries, injury severity, safety nonconformance, safety near misses and hazards, vehicle accidents, safety inquiries and contractor injuries.
