1 Q. Page 3 of NP's Application indicates that the company is seeking to set rates in 2013 2 and 2014 that will recover the forecast revenue requirement in 2013 and 2014. This 3 application therefore proposes to adopt a two-year test period for this application. 4 5 Please provide details of Canadian precedents for regulated utilities proposing, 6 and/or regulators approving, rates for a multi-year test period based on a multi-7 year revenue requirement forecast. 8 9 Newfoundland Power has not completed a study of Canadian precedents for regulated A. utilities proposing, and/or regulators approving, rates for a multi-year test period based on 10 a multi-year revenue requirement forecast. Furthermore, the information is not 11 reasonably required for the purpose of a satisfactory understanding of the matters to be 12 13 considered in this proceeding. 14 15 As indicated in response to Request for Information CA-NP-389, the Company's 16 proposal to use a two-year test period is in accordance with the *Electrical Power Control* 17 Act, 1994, is consistent with practice accepted by the Board in the past, and is reasonable in the current circumstances. A review of regulatory precedents in other jurisdictions for 18 the use of a multi-year test period is not necessary nor required for the Board to consider 19 20 the Company's Application.
