- Q. [Account 361.2 Underground Cables] As it relates to the rebuttal discussion for Account 361.2 Underground Cables as set forth on pages 14 through 19 of Appendix B, please provide a detailed listing and corresponding narrative of each of the various factors causing the Company not to begin replacing underground cable at a significant level, as referenced on page 15 of Appendix B. Further, provide all underlying documentation associated with each factor.
- 8 A. Newfoundland Power's annual capital budget is approved by the Board following a rigorous review process in which the Consumer Advocate and Board staff participate.

The Board has been quite clear in the Company's capital budget orders that "the decision to replace any asset should be made based on a complete engineering assessment of the asset itself in its current operating circumstances along with consideration of the operational, safety and reliability issues associated with any potential failure of the asset."

Similarly, the Consumer Advocate has expressed the opinion "The onus rests upon the utility to establish before the Board that the expenditures proposed are necessary in the year in which they are proposed and represent the lowest cost alternative for the provision of electricity service in the province."²

The Company has not instituted a capital program to begin replacing significant sections of underground cable principally because there is no justification based upon current operational, safety or reliability issues associated with the potential failure of underground cables. While a capital program may be needed in the future, no expenditures are currently proposed. In future, if a capital program is required, the Company will present all underlying documentation associated with each factor supporting the justification to begin replacing underground cable.
