Q. (Re: October 2014 Evidence submitted as part of Application) On page 3 lines 11 to 1 2 12 it is stated "The capacity assistance arrangement with CBPP during the 2013/14 3 winter season provided a lower fixed payment and a high variable payment". What 4 was the basis for this approach? 5 6 7 A. The capacity assistance arrangement with CBPP during the 2013/14 winter season 8 had no limitation on the number of requests per day or the number of requests in 9 the winter season. Without a cap on the number and frequency of requests the 10 impact on the CBPP operation was more significant warranting a higher variable 11 payment to compensate for the interruptions. 12 13 Maintaining an ongoing inventory of reasonably priced interruptible load/capacity 14 assistance that can be called upon in the event that system capacity constraints 15 occur (as is proposed in the Application) is common utility practice.
