As per section 3.2.3 of the report, there is no established national industry standard 9 for onsite accommodation facilities. The only Canadian written standards are 10 Alberta and British Columbia provincial standards. Both of these standards state that workers "shall be provided with a single room of not less than eighty (80) 11 square feet". Modern facilities are, however, expected to provide a reasonable level 12 13 of comfort, privacy, and safety. 14 15 Quality of work life and working conditions are important to the overall well-being 16 of employees. When working at these remote sites, employees are often required 17 to leave their homes and families for varying periods of time. Working away from home can result in emotional stresses which often times affect the worker's health 18 19 and attitude, both of which impact one's ability to work safely. Consequently, the 20 atmosphere of an accommodation facility can have an impact on the health and 21 safety of employees. The provision of a clean, well-kept accommodations facility 22 which provides for gender segregation and the option of privacy for all workers help 23 to mitigate the stresses associated with working away from home. 24 25 Constructed in 2009, Hydro's Cat Arm accommodations complex provides single 26 room occupancy, with individual washroom facilities versus a community 27 washroom, and equipped with modern communication systems, including internet

3	The Cat Arm facility was developed to meet the construction norm of modern day
4	camp facilities. Modern day facilities in Muskrat Falls, Bull Arm and the majority of
5	construction camps in British Columbia and Alberta, include single room occupancy
5	with dedicated washroom facilities. It has become the standard of acceptance
7	upon which all future Hydro site facilities will be modelled.
