The operating load forecast for A. 9 the L'Anse Au Loup system is summarized in Table 15 of the proposal report in 10 question. The L'Anse-au-Loup load forecast does not include any contributions from temporary services. The only large temporary customer currently connected 11 to the L'Anse-au-Loup system is the Valard construction camp. The Valard 12 13 construction camp demand was not included in the peak load forecast because this 14 service has backup generation that would be utilized to offset its own demand 15 during system peak conditions.
