2		Comparing Table 1 and Table 2 on page 2, does Hydro have an explanation as to
3		why its kilometer criteria for light duty vehicles are not in line with two out of the
4		three other Atlantic electric utilities?
5		
6		
7	A.	Hydro's age criteria are in line with or exceed the criteria for replacement when
8		compared to the other Atlantic Canadian Utilities. Hydro's kilometer criterion is in
9		line with one Atlantic Canadian Utility. The kilometer criterion is not in line with the
10		other two Atlantic Utilities for the following reasons:
11		a. Primarily, Hydro's fleet is utilized more frequently than the Atlantic
12		Canadian comparators on rural and remote roads that are not paved or are
13		in poor condition. For example, Hydro employees travel on many woods
14		roads to access lines as well as the Trans Labrador Highway.
15		b. Additionally, due to the rural nature of Hydro's service area, when
16		compared with the other Atlantic Canadian service areas, Hydro has a
17		smaller network of dealer repair shops that have the tooling and expertise
18		to maintain the fleet. This can result in a variance in maintenance quality.
19		There are times when service must be obtained locally, but the local repair

shops in many areas of Hydro's service territory are not equipped with the

tools and equipment required to diagnose and maintain the vehicles we use.

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
