Project C-75, Purchase Excavators-Bishop's Falls: Provide evidence that the minister has actually required, as he is given power to do under s. 261(2), a rollover protection system on the backhoes in question.

Attached is a copy of the directive from Occupational Health and Safety (OH&S) with respect to the backhoe attachments being used by Hydro. Since the directive was issued in 2005, Hydro investigated means to equip existing backhoes with Roll Over Protective Structures (ROPS). The engineering review found ROPS structures could not be fabricated, tested and attached to each unit because of stability issues and excessive costs. Each ROPS is specific to a backhoe unit and therefore, not interchangeable. Placing ROPS on existing units adds more weight which affects stability and the unit's center of gravity. Because of the OH&S directive, lighter duty equipment has been used to do heavy work which has caused unnecessary wear and tear. In some isolated cases, Hydro has also rented backhoes equipped with ROPS.

Dec. 8/05 at Bishop Falls depot observed 3 "backhoe attachments" one attached to a Go Track. This office has seen several of these attachments within municipalities and have taken immediate action to remove from service. With regard to the use of these after market attachments we have identified several hazards and concerns: lack of ROPS, FOPS and seat belts, multiple plnch points, unsafe access/egress, instability during operation and manufacturer compatibility. 4 Directives issued,
