1	Q.	Re: B-7, Upgrade Marine Terminal – Holyrood \$5,859,600 in 2012
2		Why did Hydro wait until 2012 to propose replacement of the fender that fell off in
3		2008?
4		
5		
6	A.	The 70 ton concrete gravity fender fell off the marine terminal in September 2008.
7		Hydro immediately engaged an independent consultant to complete an
8		investigation into the cause of the failure and to complete emergency repairs to
9		ensure that the remaining fenders were in no danger of failing. This work was
10		concluded in November 2008.
11		
12		In 2009, following the completion of the fender repairs, Hydro secured the required
13		funding and issued a request for proposal for engineering services to complete a
14		complete condition assessment of the Marine Terminal and provide
15		recommendations to extend the service life of the structure an additional forty
16		years. This assessment involved a detailed study of the facilities original design and
17		construction philosophies as well as current operating procedures. The final report
18		was submitted December 20, 2010.
19		
20		With the announcement of the proposed Labrador Interconnection in 2011, Hydro
21		requested that the consultant revisit the report findings and revise the
22		recommendations to included only those considered to be critical to ensuring the
23		continued operation of the facility for the next ten years. The revised report was
24		submitted on April 29, 2011 and establishes the scope of work for this proposal to
25		have the work completed in 2012.
