1	Q.	Section E – Multi-Year Projects
2		Section E, multi-year project refers to P.U. 38(2010) for approval of a number of
3		projects. Please outline the relevant sections of P.U. 38(2010) which are relied on
4		by Hydro to state that these projects were approved as multi-year projects.
5		
6		
7	A.	The Board approves the total annual and multi-year project budget subject to its
8		guidelines. In support of this, The Board of Commissioners of Public Utilities Capital
9		Budget Application Guidelines, policy number 1900.6, revision October 2007 states:
10		"Each year of an expenditure will be considered in the initial year of
11		application. Where a utility shows in each subsequent year of a multi-
12		year expenditure that the scope, nature and amount of the capital
13		expenditures are consistent with the original approval, further
14		approval is not required."
15		
16		Expenditures in subsequent years will be subject to further review if there is a
17		material change in the scope, nature or forecast cost of the expenditure. A change
18		will be considered material if the nature or scope of the expenditure changes such
19		that that original rationale provided is no longer applicable or where the revised
20		forecast expenditure exceeds the approved amount by 10% or more"
21		
22		Therefore, in capital budget 2012 any capital multi-year projects approved in P.U.
23		38(2010) that shows in each subsequent capital budget year of a multi-year
24		expenditure that the scope, nature and amount of the capital expenditures are
25		consistent with the original approval, further approval is not required.
