

1 Q. Re: Holyrood: Upgrade Unit 1 Stack Breaching

2 At page 10 of PU No 38 (2010), the board stated at p. 10, "It would appear based on  
3 the evidence, that the main reason for the proposal to add external insulation is the  
4 maintenance costs associated with the existing internal insulation. The Board notes  
5 the high maintenance costs associated with the internal insulation but, given the  
6 recent decision to proceed with the Labrador infeed and the switch to low sulfur  
7 fuel, it would appear to be prudent to maintain the existing insulation at this time  
8 and assess the maintenance costs against the significant immediate capital costs of  
9 installing external installation and ice protection." What are the projected costs of  
10 installing external insulation and ice protection in this application?

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13 A. The project costs of installing external insulation and ice protection in this  
14 application are \$461,300 and \$112,400 respectively. Refer to response to CA-NLH-9.
