Re: Newfoundland and Labrador Hydro – Amended General Rate Application – Requests for Information

Enclosed are Responses to Requests for Information NLH-PUB-485 to NLH-PUB-488 regarding the above-noted application.

The Board has determined that further information is required to complete and update the record for the Amended General Rate Application and has issued several additional information requests. These requests relate to Grant Thornton's report, dated June 12, 2015 and the recent interim rate orders (Board Order Nos. P.U. 14, 17, 18, 19 and 21(2015)). The Board asks that Hydro respond to PUB-NLH-485 to 488 by Monday, July 20, 2015.

In addition the Board acknowledges that during the interim rate application process the Consumer Advocate asked that the Board require Hydro to file further information. The Board finds that in the circumstances the other parties may also require additional information. The Board will therefore provide the parties the opportunity to file further requests for information relating to the impact of the interim rate orders by Friday July 17, 2015. Hydro will be required to respond to these requests by Monday, July 27, 2015.

In addition, in relation to Hydro's June 30, 2015 correspondence the Board requires that Hydro provide the date when the requested information will be available and confirmation that it will be filed at that time.
